Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



The Jafra Foundation, in collaboration with four other organizations—Palestinian Civil Defense, Dynamo Akkar, Ru’ya Cultural Corner, Sawa, and the Maa’n Initiative—organized a two-day event titled “Days of Joy” in Mahmoud Darwish Park in Nahr al-Bared Camp.

The event targeted more than 800 children from various nationalities and ages under 12, offering diverse recreational activities aimed at enhancing interaction among children and creating a space where they could gather away from daily challenges.

The event saw wide participation from camp residents and IDPs, fostering a positive social atmosphere and providing an opportunity for moments of relaxation and joy. This initiative reflects the commitment of the participating organizations to strengthen social cohesion and provide a collaborative environment that unites the community on common grounds.

“Days of Joy” stands as a vivid example of the significance of joint efforts among local organizations in making a positive impact within Palestinian camps.



The Jafra Foundation has announced the opening of registration for women to participate in the cash-for-work program, which aims to prepare hot meals for beneficiaries.

This program comes within the efforts of Jafra to support women in the local community by providing job opportunities that contribute to improving the living conditions in the camp.

The program, in partnership with WHH, seeks to meet the food needs of the neediest families, which suffer in making their daily living due to the deteriorating economic and social conditions in the wake of weeks of war.



The Jafra Foundation organized a community initiative aimed at improving the general appearance of the region by beautifying the sidewalks and removing visual pollution, with the wide participation of volunteers and members of the local community.

The campaign comes within the framework of the Foundation's initiatives to enhance awareness of the importance of preserving the local environment and encouraging citizens to adopt sustainable practices that contribute to improving the quality of life.

The initiative witnessed a great interaction of volunteers and the people of the local community who worked collectively to give an aesthetic touch to public places, in a move that enhances the comfort of the population and supports environmental sustainability.

Through these activities, the Jafra Foundation seeks to involve the local community in maintaining the cleanliness of their towns, and enhancing a culture of interest in the environment as part of common societal values.



Statement: One People, One Destiny

Jafra has issued a statement in the aftermath of the collapse of Al-Assad tyrant regime of Syria.

The statement stressed the historical brotherly relations between the Syrian and Palestinian peoples and the joint struggle in order to confront the challenges and liberate the occupied lands.

Jafra also called on the international community and all the powers of justice and peace to support the reconstruction efforts, ensure the return of refugees to their homes, and work for a future that preserves the dignity and rights of all.



The Jafra Centers in Syria launched a campaign to introduce children to the dangers of Unexploded Ordnance (UXO). The campaign included interactive activities aimed at consolidating these concepts in children in a simple right way for their ages. Children expressed their increasing awareness of this issue through a group of messages that reflect their understanding of what they learned and the importance of spreading awareness among their peers in society.

This campaign comes within the efforts of the Jafra Foundation to enhance the safety of children in areas that suffer from the effects of conflict, and seeks to spare them the risks caused by the widespread war waste.
