Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



As part of its ongoing efforts to support displaced families in Ein el-Hilweh camp, and through the Cash for Work program, Jafra Foundation, with the participation of 18 women, prepared hot meals under the supervision of a specialized food consultant.

The activity lasted for nine days, during which meals were delivered directly to the targeted households outside the IDP shelters. Thanks to the efforts of the Foundation's volunteers who participated in the logistics.



The Jafra Foundation has completed its initiative to install solar-powered lighting lamps in the neighborhoods of Rashidieh camp in the city of Tyre, southern Lebanon, in a move aimed at improving the level of lighting inside the camp and enhancing security for residents.

This initiative comes as part of the Foundation's ongoing efforts to improve the living conditions of Palestinian refugees in the camps, especially in light of the ongoing challenges they face.



As the first semester exams around the corner, Jafra Foundation in South Damascus - Syria continues its efforts to support students through the Winter Club and periodic follow-up sessions. These activities aim to provide students with a comprehensive review of the basic subjects, in an effort to raise their academic level and address their weaknesses.

Jafra Foundation launched a community initiative aimed at rehabilitating stairs in Burj el-Barajneh camp, south of Beirut. The initiative included paving the stairs to facilitate the movement of pedestrians, especially the elderly and people with disabilities, and to ensure a safer and more comfortable environment for the camp's residents.

Through this initiative, the Foundation seeks to improve the camp's infrastructure and enhance daily living conditions, as part of its ongoing efforts to support local communities and provide practical solutions to the challenges they face.



Jafra Foundation commemorated the International Day of Education through social media by recalling the memory of the martyrs from the students and teachers of the steadfast Gaza Strip, where the occupation killed more than 12,000 students and 400 teachers and deprived more than 800,000 other students of education.



Jafra Foundation launched an initiative to improve infrastructure in Shatila camp in Beirut. The initiative included lighting the main streets and improving roads, especially in areas close to schools and kindergartens inside the camp, as part of efforts to provide a safer environment for residents and avoid accidents and thefts. The foundation confirmed that this step comes in response to the urgent needs of the camp residents, and aims to enhance the sense of security and improve the quality of daily life, especially for children and families residing in the area.
