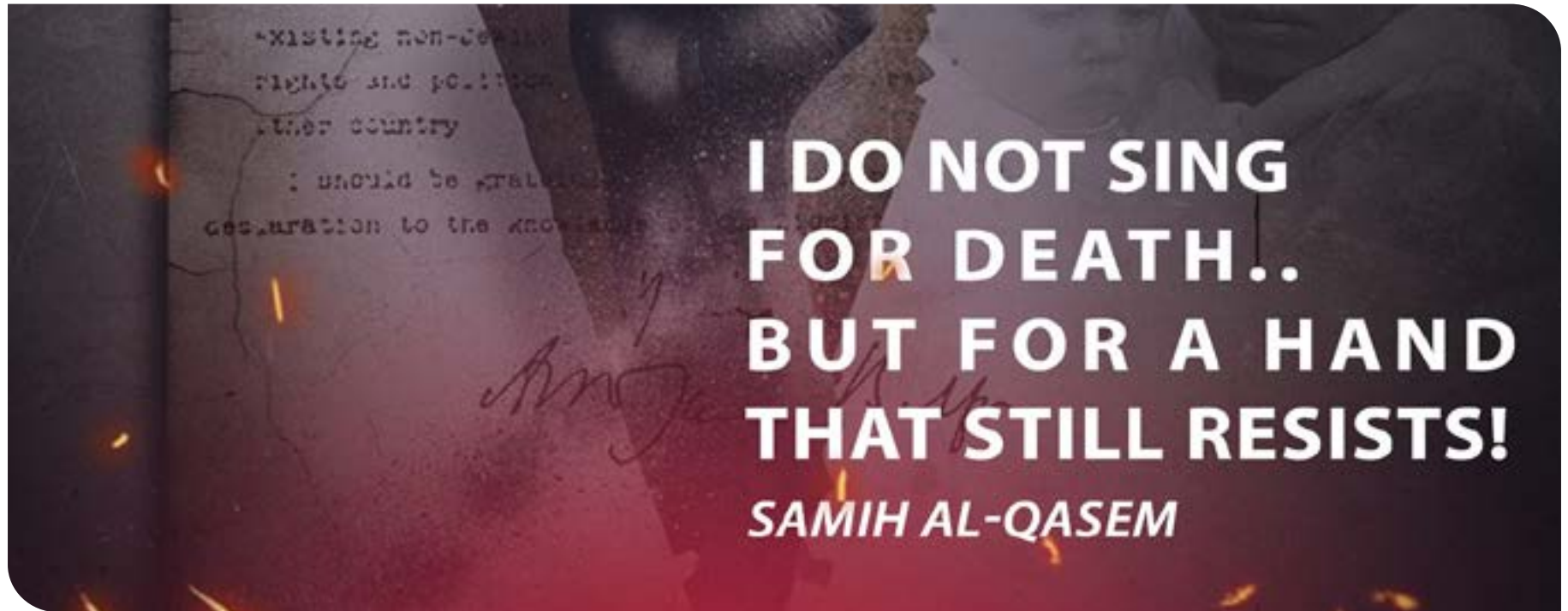

Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



The Jafra Foundation commemorates the anniversary of the infamous Balfour Declaration on November 2nd of each year.

The letter sent in 1917 by the British Foreign Secretary to Lord Lionel Rothschild, a leading figure in the Zionist movement at the time, later known as the Balfour Declaration, is considered the first step taken by the West to establish a Jewish entity on Palestinian land. In it, the British government pledged to establish a Jewish state in Palestine.

The text of the letter is as follows:

“His Majesty’s Government views with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people, and will use their best endeavours to facilitate the achievement of this object, it being clearly understood that nothing shall be done which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of existing non-Jewish communities in Palestine, or the rights and political status enjoyed by Jews in any other country.”

Statement of Condemnation of the Occupation Terrorist Attack on Ein al-Hilweh Camp

On the evening of Tuesday, November 18, 2025, the Israeli Air Force committed a horrific massacre by targeting a playground in the Ein al-Hilweh Palestinian refugee camp. The attack resulted in the deaths of 14 people including minors, as well as a number of injuries and fires breaking out at the site.

The Jafra Foundation mourns the victims and extends its deepest condolences to their families. It expresses its strongest condemnation of this terrorist attack, which reflects the barbarity of the occupation and its supporters. It also denounces the international silence regarding the repeated violations committed by the occupation and its continued targeting of innocent civilians.

The Jafra Foundation condemned the horrific massacre perpetrated by the barbaric and fascist Zionist occupation forces on November 18, which claimed the lives of 14 martyrs, including youths under the age of 18, in the Ain al-Hilweh Palestinian refugee camp in Sidon, southern Lebanon.

In its statement, the Foundation called upon the international community, the Security Council, and all relevant human rights and humanitarian organizations to assume their responsibilities in halting the ongoing barbaric Zionist aggression against innocent civilians, holding the perpetrators of war crimes in the Zionist entity accountable, exposing its crimes and violations, ending the occupation, and putting an end to the suffering of the Palestinian people, which has persisted for over 70 years.



Through its activities, the Jafra Foundation strives to raise community awareness among various segments of society, including youth, children, and women. In cooperation with the Child Protection Network in Burj al-Barajneh camp, the foundation held an interactive dialogue session with the Popular Committee, addressing ways to improve the situation of children in the camp and enhance the services provided to them. Participants discussed the most prominent challenges facing children, along with practical proposals to improve the social and educational environment.

Additionally, in coordination with the Lebanese Democratic Women's Gathering, the foundation organized an awareness lecture on emotional intelligence at its center in Burj al-Barajneh camp, Beirut.

These sessions are part of the empowerment and development program implemented by Jafra in refugee camps, which aims to inform various social groups about their human rights guaranteed by law and how to defend them.
