Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



Eid celebrations kicked off the month of May. For the occasion, Jafra remained active and prepared a number of activities to allow residents and participants to enjoy the Holiday in dignity. Among the actions, Jafra Waste Management teams cleaned the cemeteries in their various areas, while Jafra volunteers handed out sweets made by the Jafra Food Production workshops to the residents of their communities.



Every year in May, Palestinians commemorate the Nakba and celebrate Jerusalem as the capital of the whole Palestine. This year was marked by the death of Shirin Abu Aqleh, a much-appreciated Palestinian journalist, who was killed by the occupation force while on duty. Jafra will not forget, and the date of the crime against her will be remembered in the coming years, as a crime against the Palestinian people.



The participants in Lebanon's Urban Rooftop Jafra project were taught how to make compost. Following a collaboration with Compost Baladi, Jafra provided each participant with a compost machine for personal use as well as for resale when additional compost is available.



Students were prepared by their teachers in the various sites where Jafra delivers education in Syria to pass the approaching official and non-official examinations which will mark the end of the 2021-2022 school year. Jafra Centers are also preparing for Summer Clubs in a variety of places.
