Jafra for Relief and Youth Development

Continuation of the Waste Management Project at Burj el Barajneh and Shatila

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In the beginning of July, Jafra Foundation continued its waste management project at the Shatila and Burj el Barajneh by coordinating with UNRWA to ensure the provision of the best services.

Our working team at the camps let the youth participate in the project that contributes in creating a positive impact on the camps by improving streets and cleaning them to provide hygiene, safety and make them suitable for living. The Jafra Centers in Syria and Lebanon organized a set of recreational activities in celebration of Eid Al-Adha to make the children happy. The activities were attended by hundreds of children at different centers and they could spend all day with the volunteers who prepared a multitude of recreational activities, motion games that created a very exciting atmosphere and unforgettable memories.



More than 30 children were present during the month of July every day to participate in sports and musical activities organized by the Jafra Center in Homs.

The children learned during the event self defense under the supervision of a specialized coach and among them was Shady that prepared for 3 months to participate in the national championship in Homs.

Alongside sports, there was music all the time in the center where 12 children learned the basics of singing and playing instruments under the supervision of a specialized instructor. The Jafra Center in Homs takes care of introducing the children to Palestinian songs and reinforce their ideas about the cause.



At the end of July, a new session to teach English was introduced at the south Damascus Jafra Center.

Considering the appeal of inhabitants of the area to learn English, the center opened its doors to those willing to study between the ages of 18 and 45 years.

This workshop will focus on teaching an initial level of language and basics to the participants until they can improve their knowledge and expertise and move on to other levels.
