Jafra Launches Disinfection Campaign in Camps

To tackle the increasing risk of the novel COVID19 pandemic, Jafra Foundation launched an extensive disinfection campaign in all of the refugee camps and gatherings of its operations in Syria and Lebanon. The campaign included the camps of Jaramana, Qudsaya, South Damascus and Homs in Syria and the camps of Burj Al-Barajneh, Shatila and Ein El-Hilweh in Lebanon. Many of areas were sterilized; our volunteers' efforts are ongoing.



A “Parental Care” training was held in the Jafra center in Qudsaya to enhance the skills of Jafra’s facilitators to support parents and all child caregivers in offering children the protection from all forms of violence. The training was attended by 7 facilitators.



This year is exceptional, since the COVID19 virus outbreak has forced households to stay home.

However, we did not forget mothers within these circumstances. Our volunteers in Burj Al-Barajneh camp delivered handcraft materials to the children to allow them celebrate their mothers.

We sent them videos with instructions that teach them to make presents themselves.



Jafra center in South Damascus has continued provision of services just before the declaration of the lockdown due to the threat of the COVID19 pandemic. Various trainings were held for different ages and both sexes in domains such as electrical wiring, womanly dressing and food industry. The trainings aimed at enabling beneficiaries to acquire new skills that could help in enhancing their livelihood and finding job opportunities. For more details:
