Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



In May, Jafra Foundation held 2-days training for the beneficiaries of the rooftop gardening project in the Palestinian refugee camps of Shatila, Burj El-Barajneh and Ein El-Hilweh respectively.

Following the completion of the training, the participants started to plant in their own spaces with guidance and support from our team which provided them with the farming tools, seeds, seedlings, pots and soil.

The project supported by Welthungerhilfe (WHH) organization will offer beneficiary households the opportunity to plant different crops on their rooftops.



In conjunction with the recent events in the occupied Palestine and the war on Gaza strip, Jafra team held awareness raising sessions for kids in particular, during which, they addressed the nature of the current events in the occupied Palestine, within their historical context. The children were also introduced to an explanation on the Palestinian cities, villages and heritage.

The sessions held all over our centers in Syria and Lebanon witnessed a notable reaction from the kids who expressed in different ways their solidarity with the Palestinian children against the oppression they have been facing.



Jafra centers in Syria have completed registration of beneficiaries to their summer club activity that targets children between 6-18 years old. The club includes various activities combining education and recreation. The children will benefit from activities like drawing, handworks, theatre, singing sports, computer skills and mental calculation.

Jafra center in Homs camp resumes trainings within the youth development project after over 30-day-suspension. The trainings include English and computer sciences for 30 participants for 3 months.

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Jafrat team in South Damascus carries on offering support and consult to the participants of the agricultural development project. Over 30 dunums of land have been reclaimed in cooperation with the most vulnerable population such as Mr. Nabil whose health condition did not prevent him from continuous work in the land to meet his family's need of food.

The same for Layla who has chosen livestock project alongside other 30 households.

Jafrat team offers the full support and follow-up through specialized people. The project which will continue until August 2021, could offer crops for hundreds of households in the area so far.



Denouncing the Israeli occupation's crimes, Jafra volunteers take a part in the solidarity with the Palestinian people vigil in front of the UN office in Damascus. During the vigil, the protestors raised the Palestinian flags and banners that condemn the occupation crimes against our people in Palestine in particular in Gaza and Jerusalem. Palestinian and Syrian youth stress their adherence to the Palestinian cause.
