Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



After the summer clubs have ended, it is time to return to school in Syria. While learning never stops at Jafra, the winter months bring a more structured educational schedule that moves every student up a level each year and prepares students in the 9th and 12th grades for formal tests.



Many enterprises all around the world have changed to become internet businesses or use social media as a storefront. Jafra Community Center in Qudsaya offers an E-marketing course, allowing participants to learn about the digital technologies and their applications.



From the age of 4 to 22, children and youth can continue their education at Jafra. After students complete their baccalaureate, Jafra stays by their side to help them choose the appropriate academic specialization to advance in the field they want to pursue.



In Lebanon, it's been 2 years Jafra enrolls women to teach them the basic principles of working in a community kitchen and produce food. Participants are delivered diplomas at the end of their course, attesting their new skills towards future potential employers.



Despite the work that numerous NGOs are doing in Syria and Lebanon to lessen human suffering, there are situations that the international community should deal with as it is responsible when vulnerable populations in despair flee their location along perilous routes in an effort to simply survive somewhere else.
