Because there is a lack of energy in Lebanon, the country's streets become dark and unsafe at night. The problem is worse in the camps because even individual households occasionally cannot afford to have lights on at night. In order to lighten the streets and make it safer for camp residents to use the pathways at night, Jafra cooperated with the local organizations to install solar-powered lamps. Thus far, the project has benefited the camps of Ein el Hilweh and Rashidieh.



The children at Jafra's Centers started making preparations at the beginning of the Ramadan month, which started at the end of March this year. The centers needed a lot of preparation, but not only that—every child is always glad to carry decorations home, making their caregivers delighted and pleased with the vibrant results.
