Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



As the Zionist war on the Gaza Strip continues for the third month in a row, children in Jafra centers in Syria and Lebanon expressed their solidarity and support for the children of Gaza in light of the painful reality they are enduring, through a number of activities such as drawing sessions, drama performances, and national awareness sessions.



Jafra-Syria, in cooperation with the Sabaa Foundation, participated on the stage of the House of Culture in Homs in presenting the play Al-Shira, which is about the operation Al-Aqsa flood and the painful events experienced by the people of the Gaza Strip.



The Jafra Foundation's services team in Syria and Lebanon continued to work with all its capabilities to provide a clean, disease-free environment in Palestinian camps and gatherings. The team targeted the places most in need of service and community support in these places. The team worked seven days a week in the areas most in need of service, constantly cleaning the main and sub-streets and the areas in the vicinity of the schools.



Jafra attaches utmost importance to the issue of child protection and providing a safe environment and friendly space for them, along with the process of empowerment and awareness. In the My Safe Space campaign at the Jafra Center in Homs camp, children learned how to choose trusted people within the circle of family and friends, their importance in their lives, the support they offer in daily life, and asking for help when facing a problem that exposes the child to danger.



December witnessed escalation of fears that Lebanon would be drawn into war as a result of border battles and assassinations. The Jafra Center in Rashidieh Camp held a series of first aid training, through which participants learned how to deal with injuries in emergency situations.



Jafra has launched several initiatives to serve communities. This month, it was the case of Burj al-Barajneh camp, where the services team fixed the random electricity cables spread throughout the neighborhoods and alleys of the camp and separated them from the water supply net to get rid of the danger that was threatening the residents.
