Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



Statement Issued by the Palestinian Civil Society of the Refugee Camps in Lebanon

The Jafra Foundation invited civil society organizations in Palestinian refugee camps in Lebanon to consultative meetings, the outcome of which was agreement to issue a joint statement to formulate a unified position on the crisis of cutting off funding for UNRWA and its repercussions on the conditions of Palestinian refugees. A number of Western countries, led by Washington, announced at the end of last January that they would suspend financial support for UNRWA after the occupation claimed that 11 of the agency's employees participated in the operation Al-Aqsa Flood on October 7, without providing any evidence to support those allegations. Bad weather conditions, cold, and rain do not prevent the Jafra services team in southern Damascus from doing their job. The team works with dedication and sincerity to continue the service process to maintain a healthy and clean environment free of epidemics and with a decent civilized appearance. The work is focused is on the vicinity of schools, mosques and vital centers in the area.



In cooperation with civil society organizations in Shatila camp, Jafra implemented the initiative to fix public electricity in a number of neighborhoods. Earlier to the initiative, residents of these neighborhoods were complaining of power issues such as frequent malfunctions, random cables, and overloads. These issues put residents, especially children, at risk of electric shock, in particular during the rainy season. Street-lights were also installed in the aforementioned neighborhoods. The initiative was warmly welcomed by the locals and shop owners, who took the initiative to provide all assistance to the work team.



Jafra is constantly working to develop its educational programs utilizing the latest methods and tools, with the help of a qualified and experienced teaching staff. In order to achieve the best results from the educational process, the Foundation's centers are interested in continuously reach out to the students' parents. They are invited to discuss the potential problems that their children may be exposed to and how to coordinate between the administration and the home. The goal is to provide support to them by keeping a safe environment that helps them to acquire academic achievement.
