Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



Jafra Foundation commemorated the 76th anniversary of the Nakba in all its work sites. Our centers held a range of activities, including dialogue sessions, workshops and seminars, with the aim of introducing the Palestinian issue and the right of Palestinian refugees to return to their homes. Jafra volunteers also participated in mass national events in coordination with Palestinian civil society organizations in Palestinian refugee camps in Syria and Lebanon. The name “Nakba” is given to the catastrophe that befell the Palestinian people following the declaration of “Israel” in 1948. It led to the destruction of more than 500 Palestinian villages and towns and the displacement of more than 800,000 Palestinians.



The educational program at the Jafra Foundation is a top priority given the importance of education in building an advanced and productive society. Therefore, Jafra centers in Syria and Lebanon continue to provide educational services for the basic, intermediate and secondary levels. Intensive courses that aim to raise the educational level of students are held with an efficient and professional educational staff. Jafra also attaches importance to the role of the family in the educational process and is keen to meet with parents on a regular basis with the aim of enhancing cooperation between parents and the center's management and discussing the challenges facing students.



The child protection program at Jafra Foundation includes maintaining the mental and physical wellbeing of children. In cooperation with the Beit Atfal Al-Samoud Foundation, the Jafra Center in Burj Shemali Palestinian refugee camp in southern Lebanon held an awareness session for children on how to care for teeth and ways to prevent diseases.



The services team at the Jafra Center in Burj al-Barajneh camp continues to work diligently, targeting the places that need service support. In cooperation with the UNRWA services team, Jafra volunteers sprayed pesticides to control insects inside the camp neighborhoods. This comes in response to the calls of the Households, and with the aim of maintaining a clean and healthy environment free of diseases. Thanks for you for the hardworking, guys!



In cooperation with the Palestinian Red Crescent, the Jafra Foundation in Jaramana Camp and the Qudsaya Gathering organized awareness sessions for women. The sessions included several topics, such as how to detect pregnancy and health care during pregnancy, in addition to nutritional advice, psychological care for the mother and fetus, issues related to child protection, the role of the family in society, and how to boost family relationships.
