Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



At Jafra Foundation, we're committed to making a difference in the lives of Palestinian refugee children who have faced unimaginable hardship in Syria. These children, who have lost their homes and dreams, are now at risk of losing their education.

Our Education Program is working tirelessly to provide safe spaces where these children can learn, grow, and rebuild their futures.

This month, Jafra initiated a fundraising campaign to turn hope into reality and give these children a chance to dream again. 1,200 students in Syrian are beneficiaries from Jafra Education Program.



In light of August hot weather, the service team at the Jafra Center in southern Damascus continues its efforts to clean the streets and alleys in coordination with the municipality. On the occasion of the International Youth Day, the Jafra Center in Qudsaya opened the Youth Cultural Club. The first session began with a screening of the film “Jenin, Jenin”, by the Palestinian director Mohammed Bakri. The screening was followed by an extensive discussion about the events that took place in the Jenin camp during its invasion by the Zionist fascists in 2002. The club aims to include young people in various cultural and artistic activities to develop their talents and skills in different fields.



Jafra Center in Qudsaya organized an educational trip for children to the Educational Center for Fine Arts (Mumtaz Al-Bahra Center). There, they learned about different forms of art such as sculpture, pottery, murals, mosaics and collage. The trip was an opportunity to enhance children's creativity and encourage them to express themselves through fine arts. It also organized a visit to the Damascus Educational Museum to learn about its diverse contents. The trip was completed with a visit to the Damascus Educational Library, where children had the opportunity to explore books and educational resources. This trip came to enhance children's passion for learning and discovering knowledge and to encourage them to culture and read.



The Palestinian National Program workshop series continues at Jafra Centers. Jafra Center in Homs Camp organized a workshop for volunteers to prepare them to transfer this valuable knowledge to children. This step is important to develop the skills of volunteers and enhance their ability to present information in an interactive way.

At Jafra Center in Qudsaya, children learned about the historical geography of Palestine, including all its cities and villages. They identified these cities and villages the map, and learned about the most important archaeological landmarks in each city, which helped them enhance their knowledge of their country's history and identity.



Despite the complex security conditions in Ain al-Hilweh camp in southern Lebanon, the Jafra football team continues training to improve the players' skills and prepare for local tournaments. As part of sports cooperation, the Jafra team plays friendly matches with local clubs to enhance sportsmanship and communication between players.
