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Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



Jafra has initiated an urgent fundraising campaign to relief the vulnerable internally displaced people by the “Israeli” war on Lebanon. The campaign will help deliver clean water, food, essential non-food items like blankets and mattresses, and dignity kits for women and girls. As a rapid emergency response, Jafra is committed to swiftly addressing critical needs and ensuring the health, dignity, and survival of those affected. Together, we can make a difference to support the resilience of the civilians in Lebanon.



Jafra Centers in Syria concluded the Child Summer, which this year witnessed a great diversity of activities and events targeting all age groups of children. The activities included reading sessions, drawing, recycling, and choir, in addition to entertainment and educational segments to enhance the spirit of cooperation and creativity. National activities were also allocated within the Palestinian national curriculum, in addition to segments of Palestinian folklore. The program also included outdoor activities with the aim of giving children new experiences. This included visits to the flower exhibition and local gardens.



Under the auspices of Homs Governorate and under the supervision and coordination of the Refugee Department in Homs, and under the slogan (Together, Our Governorate is More Beautiful), Jafra volunteers participated in the popular cleaning campaign at the level of the governorate. The campaign included the Al-Aedeen Camp in Homs and focused on cleaning the surroundings of schools, roads, parks and public squares, with the participation of neighborhood committees, popular activities, local community institutions, civil society organizations, and the Environment Directorate.



Jafra is constantly working to develop its educational programs utilizing the latest methods and tools, with the help of a qualified and experienced teaching staff. In order to achieve the best results from the educational process, the Foundation's centers are interested in continuously reach out to the students' parents. They are invited to discuss the potential problems that their children may be exposed to and how to coordinate between the administration and the home. The goal is to provide support to them by keeping a safe environment that helps them to acquire academic achievement.



In cooperation with the Y-Peers Network, an interactive theatre was organized for adolescents at the Jafra Center in Qudsaya. During the training sessions, participants delved into discussing key community issues and exchanged views on different topics. It contributes to enhancing their social communication and raising awareness of the importance of community participation. The adolescents also learned about the types of interactive theatre and its effective role in expressing vital issues that concern the community.
