



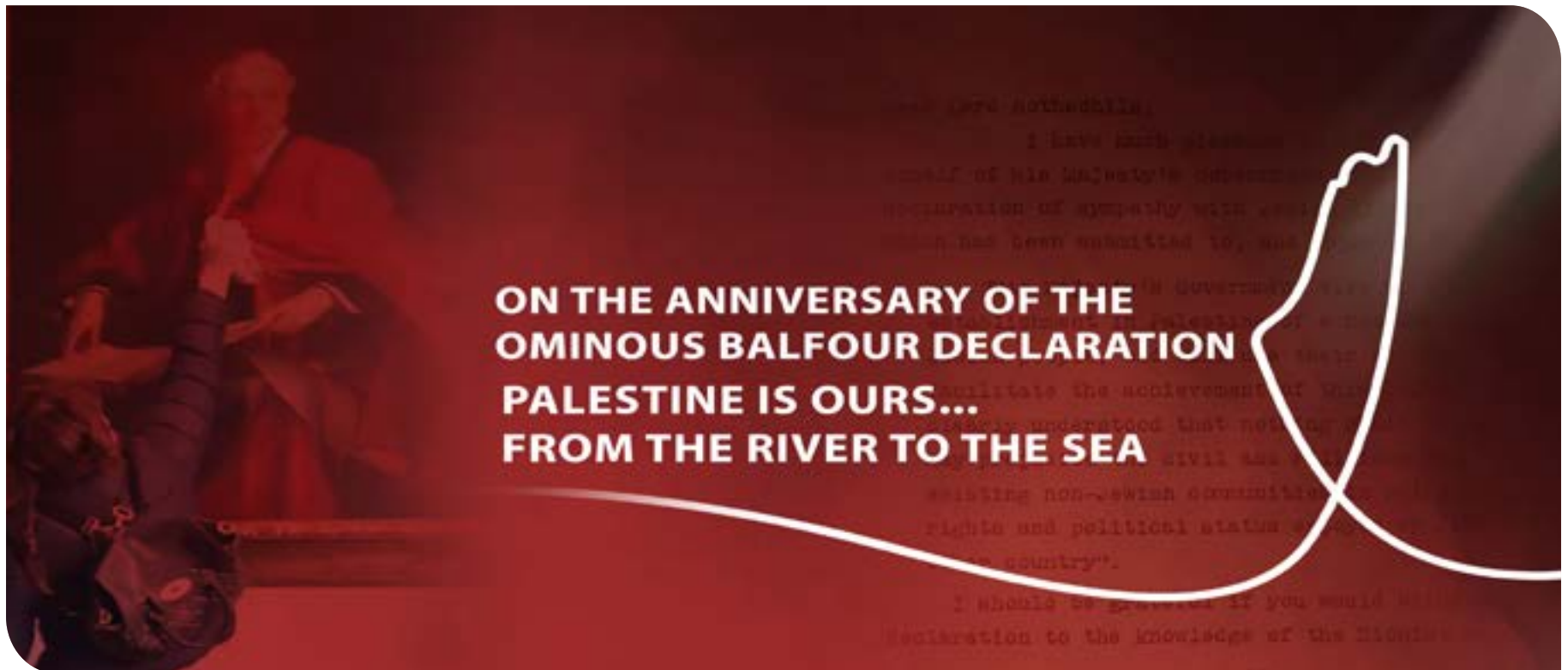

Jafra for Relief and Youth Development



The Jafra Foundation's campaign to provide relief to displaced families and families affected by the "Israeli" war on Lebanon is continuous. In its various work locations inside the Palestinian refugee camps in cooperation with local institutions, Jafra has provided water, distributed meals and winter clothes, and cleaned the streets and alleys of waste.



The Jafra Foundation in Syria and Lebanon commemorated the anniversary of the infamous Balfour Declaration, by which the land of the Palestinian people was granted to the Zionist movement by the colonialist Britain. More than 12 million Palestinians to this day continue to suffer from the consequences of the Western Zionist colonial project on the land of Palestine, which seeks to exterminate and expel the legitimate owners of the land, steal their lands, control the peoples of the region, and plunder their wealth with the support of Western colonial powers. JAFRA Foundation launched the “Model Neighborhood” initiative in Beddawi Camp in Tripoli, North Lebanon, where it lit up a number of neighborhoods in the camp with the aim of improving the living environment for residents.

It also started a project to restore and clean Mahmoud Darwish Park in Nahr al-Bared Camp in Tripoli, North Lebanon, where this initiative aims to improve public spaces within the camp and provide a clean and safe environment for residents. In addition to cleaning and restoration work, the project includes the installation of new lighting that is expected to be completed in the next phase, to include Mahmoud Darwish Park in addition to the al-Nahr neighborhood.



Jafra Foundation attaches great importance to the youth cadre building program by enhancing and developing their skills. At the end of November, Jafra Center in Homs concluded a specialized training course in the fields of photography and preparing a “psychological support facilitator.” The course was distinguished by providing rich and purposeful information to the participants, which contributes to developing their skills and enhancing their capabilities in photography and providing psychological support.



The Winter Club for Children continues to provide various educational and recreational activities. Coinciding with the start of the first review period of the first semester, the “Jafra” Foundation in southern Damascus, through periodic follow-up sessions, organizes comprehensive reviews for students in the basic subjects. The follow-up sessions aim to enhance students’ understanding of the curriculum and prepare them to take exams and obtain the best results. All the best to our dear students!
