



Statement of Condemnation of the Occupation Terrorist Attack on Ein al-Hilweh Camp

On the evening of Tuesday, November 18, 2025, the Israeli Air Force committed a horrific massacre by targeting a playground in the Ein al-Hilweh Palestinian refugee camp. The attack resulted in the deaths of 14 people including minors, as well as a number of injuries and fires breaking out at the site.

The Jafrā Foundation mourns the victims and extends its deepest condolences to their families. It expresses its strongest condemnation of this terrorist attack, which reflects the barbarity of the occupation and its supporters. It also denounces the international silence regarding the repeated violations committed by the occupation and its continued targeting of innocent civilians.

Jafrā considers this attack, which followed an Israeli airstrike on southern Lebanon that resulted in the deaths of 2 Lebanese citizens and damage to a school bus carrying students, a flagrant violation of international law and all humanitarian norms and conventions. It adds to the Zionism long history of crimes, violations, and aggression.

This aggression comes at a time of escalating popular and official condemnation worldwide against the criminal practices of the occupation, and growing calls for boycotting Tel Aviv, imposing sanctions, ending the occupation, and establishing a Palestinian state. The world has become convinced that the Zionist terrorist military poses a threat to global peace through its state terrorism against the Palestinian people and the peoples of the region, and its blatant defiance of the international community and legal organizations.

In conclusion, Jafrā calls upon the international community, the Security Council, and all relevant human rights organizations to assume their responsibilities in halting the ongoing aggression against innocent civilians, holding the perpetrators of war crimes in the far-right Tel Aviv accountable, exposing their crimes and violations, ending the occupation, and putting an end to the suffering of the Palestinian people, which has persisted for over 70 years.
